Be a mentor to a public school student.



Who is this opportunity for?

Men & Women (Ages 18+)

What is involved in this opportunity?

Mentor RUSD provides a school-based, one-to-one approach to mentorship for elementary and middle school students. Mentoring focuses on academic achievement, goal setting, and establishing a positive relationship with a positive adult role model. Mentors are asked to make a commitment to mentoring for one academic year, and to meet with the student for least one hour a week. In most cases the meeting will be at the students' schools, but some meetings, with parent permission, may take place outside of the school.

Is this a recurring, ongoing commitment? If so, how frequent?

Yes. One hour, one day a week, during the academic school year.

Is there any cost?

No.

Where does the ministry take place?

Meetings take place at the mentee's school or, with parent permission, outside of school.

What steps are required to be involved?

Step 1: Reach out to to the primary contact person. (Contact info below)

Step 2: Complete an application and background check forms. Visit:

Step 3: Complete interview.

Step 4: Complete orientation program (2 hours).

Step 5: Get matched with a student (this can take some time).

Step 6: Initial meeting with mentee at the school.
