Sermon Review Discussion Questions

These questions are for *after* the sermon and can be used for Life Group discussion, one-to-one discipleship, or personal reflection and application.

After the Jerusalem Council, Paul and Barnabas set off on a second missionary journey that hardly goes as planned. Personal conflict, a change in destination, and a stint in jail mark this trip. But what we see is God's full control over all that happens and his using these events to further the kingdom.

Discussion Questions

1. In 15:37-40, we see Paul and Barnabas get into a dispute and separate over it. Who do you think was right? Does it ultimately matter? How can this event give us a different perspective when thinking about conflicts and splits within the church?
2. Read 16:1-5. Why was it wise to have Timothy circumcised? Give examples of something similar we might do that isn't a biblical requirement of us but helpful in reaching a people group with the gospel.
3. In 16:6-10, we see Paul and Silas's sensitivity to God's leading them to Macedonia. What does being sensitive to the Lord's leading look like practically in our lives today? Should we expect visions as Paul experienced in the passage? Is this the norm? Explain.
4. In Philippi, we see the gospel cause conflict when they cast a demon out of a slave girl and it negatively affects the profits of her owners. In what ways does the gospel offend the sensibilities of our culture here in the United States? Share a story of a time where the gospel offended your sensibilities.
5. When you consider the stories in this passage, what encourages you the most? In what ways are you challenged? Spend time praying that we would have a greater trust in God's control over the mission of the church to spread the gospel.

Next Week's Sermon Preparation

These questions are for personal use during the week to help you prepare for next week's passage, Acts 17:1-34.

Context

1. What has happened so far in the narrative?
2. Have there been any major events, characters or themes?
3. What has happened just prior to the section you are reading?

Observation

1. What do you learn about the main characters in this section? How does the author describe them? How do they describe themselves?
2. Is time or place significant in the events that happen in the passage?
3. Is there a conflict or high point in the passage?
4. Do you think there is a main point or theme in this section of the story?
5. What surprises are there?

Meaning

1. Are there any 'editorial' comments from the author about the events in the narrative? How do these comments illuminate what is happening?
2. Does someone in the narrative learn something or grow in some way? How? What does this person learn?
3. What does the passage reveal about who Jesus is, and what he came into the world to do?
4. How could you sum up the meaning of this passage in your own words?

Application

1. How does this passage challenge (or confirm) your understanding?
2. Is there some attitude you need to change?
3. What does this passage teach you about being a disciple of Jesus?
