

SERMON REVIEW DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

These questions are for *after* the sermon and can be used for Life Group discussion, one-to-one discipleship, or personal reflection and application.

This week we are continuing our series “Know The Story” where we are taking a wide view look at the whole Bible to see that it tells one cohesive story, from Genesis to Revelation. In this week’s passage, God’s people the Israelites, the sons and daughters of Abraham, have been made slaves in Egypt. But God has a plan to rescue them. In His final plague, He will pass through the land of Egypt and strike down all the firstborn. In order to protect the Israelites from this judgment, God tells them to slaughter a lamb and put its blood on the doorposts of their house, so that the destroyer might pass over them. This is their Independence Day. And every year they are to celebrate it every year by remembering what God has done.

Discussion Questions

1. Think of your favorite holiday. What is the purpose of that day? Why and how do you celebrate it?
2. The passage starts off with God rearranging the calendar, so that Passover happens in the first month of the year. How would this benefit the future generations in their remembrance of this day?
3. God requires the Israelites to sacrifice a spotless lamb and spread its blood on their doorposts in order to be spared of God’s judgment. What’s the significance of the lamb’s blood in preventing death? Read what Genesis 9:3-4 says about blood. How does that help you understand the meaning of the Passover ritual?
4. In verses 14-20, God gives very specific instructions regarding the Feast of Unleavened Bread. What is the purpose of this festival? God makes it very clear not to eat leavened bread during this time. Why is that so important?
5. The Apostle Paul reframes the Passover to apply it to the church. In 1 Corinthians 5:6-8, Paul says that Christ is our Passover Lamb, and so we must celebrate him by imitating him in character. How can you appropriately celebrate the Lord Jesus, who shed his blood so that the judgment of God would pass over you?
