SERMON REVIEW DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

These questions are for *after* the sermon and can be used for Life Group discussion, one-to-one discipleship, or personal reflection and application.

Last week, we learned that the direction of the king's heart determines the direction of the kingdom. An imperfect king turns the heart of the kingdom away from God, but we long for a better King in Jesus who never turns the kingdom away. This week, we learn that God is doing a new thing. He is making a new covenant. His people had broken the covenant, failing to keep terms that God gave Moses on Mount Sinai. And now they are facing exile as punishment. So on what basis is God going to make a new covenant when all that people have ever done is sin? He is going to forgive them. And what is this new covenant going to take? A radical heart replacement. This week we learn that our relationship with God is broken, but through Jesus God has made a way to fix it permanently.

Discussion Questions

1. Has there been a season in your life when it felt like you were “turning a page”? When you were starting over or starting something new? What change brought in that season, and what was that season like?
2. Right before our passage, Jeremiah writes, “The fathers have eaten sour grapes, and the children’s teeth are set on edge” (31:29). In other words, the “fathers” have broken God’s covenant, and the “children” are about to experience exile as punishment. As they face exile, how might 31:31-34 have encouraged them? How does this context affect how you read this passage?
3. In this passage, God is comparing and contrasting the old covenant (see v. 32) and the new covenant. What are the similarities and differences? Consider comparing and contrasting this passage with Exodus 34:1-35.
4. Why did there need to be a new covenant? What was God going to base this new covenant on (see the last sentence of v. 34)? And what is this new covenant going to take (see where God will write His law in v. 33)? What is it inside of us that needs to be made new?
5. Today’s passage talks about this new covenant being personal, about the renewed relationship between God and His people, about being taught by God. Read Jesus’ words in John 6:45-51; 14:15-17, and 22-23. How might these verses further illuminate today’s passage? How can you be taught by God? How can you know God?
