SERMON REVIEW DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

These questions are for *after* the sermon and can be used for Life Group discussion, one-to-one discipleship, or personal reflection and application.

After almost an entire year, we have reached the conclusion to the book of Revelation. The prophecy has been given to John and now we are instructed on how to go forward in light of it. Jesus is coming soon; and the reality of this truth propels his people to live faithfully until that day.

Discussion Questions

- 1. We have now reached the end of our walk through Revelation. What stands out as the main thing that you will take away from this series? What have you learned that you hadn't realized before?
- 2. The main thrust of this passage is that Jesus is coming soon? What is meant by 'soon' and how does that affect our outlook on life today?
- 3. In verse 8, John writes that he falls down and worships the angel who is showing him these things. Why do you suppose that John is prone to this (see 19:10)? What might this say about us when it comes to worship?
- 4. Verse 14 tells us that those who wash their robes will have access to the city and to the tree of life. Given the whole history of the Bible, why is this so significant? What is being accomplished by describing unbelievers as outside the city (vs.15) instead of in the lake of fire?
- 5. In verses 17 & 19 we hear multiple invitations to 'come'. What are these invitations about?
- 6. Living in anticipation of Christ's imminent return is essential to faithful living. Do you agree? Why or why not? Looking at your own decisions and habits, do you live with this in mind?
