SERMON REVIEW DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

These questions are for *after* the sermon and can be used for Life Group discussion, one-to-one discipleship, or personal reflection and application.

This week we began a new book together as Pastor Mike presented Ecclesiastes 1:1–11 to us. It's probably safe to say that we couldn't have picked a more dissimilar book from Revelation than this. If Revelation is a view of what is going on behind the curtain, Ecclesiastes is a study of the curtain itself. What is this world that we dwell in and what do we make of the lives we live in it?

Discussion Questions

- 1. Were you familiar with the book of Ecclesiastes prior to the beginning of the series? What have been your impressions about the book? Do you look forward to this series? Why or why not?
- 2. The term, 'vanity', is used more than any other in Ecclesiastes. What does it mean? How does our understanding of this word affect our understanding of the author's overall message?
- 3. In verses 4 7 the author uses a lot of language about nature. What message is he trying to convey?
- 4. The phrase, 'there is nothing new under the sun' presents some ideas that will be repeated throughout this book. What does this mean? How does believing that there is nothing new affect how we think about our world around us and the things that we see happening in it?
- 5. Read verse 11 again. What kind of feelings does a verse like this produce in you? Is this supposed to create hopelessness or something else? What might it be?
- 6. How does the gospel, especially all that we have been walking through in Revelation over the last year, aid us in how we read a passage like this and in its proper context?
