SERMON REVIEW DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

These questions are for *after* the sermon and can be used for Life Group discussion, one-to-one discipleship, or personal reflection and application.

Last week, we saw that God's sovereignty over all aspects of all things is something to which we can humbly and even joyfully submit. As we continue in Ecclesiastes this week we will follow the Preacher as he ponders how one is to live or find purpose in a world filled with wickedness, injustice, and oppression. How does God's sovereignty carry over into these aspects of our fallen world and is there any place we can truly find comfort in the midst of suffering in our own lives and those around us?

Discussion Questions

- 1. What kind of injustices most bother you? Is there a certain group of people or a certain type of situation where you most hate to see evil and oppression? What is it about this kind of wickedness that bothers you and what is most often your response to such injustice?
- 2. Throughout this passage, the Preacher identifies three things to be "better" (3:22; 4:3; and 4:6). Examine each of these statements and paraphrase these statements in your own words to better understand what the writer of Ecclesiastes is saying in these statements.
- 3. In these verses, the Preacher, at first glance, seems to be talking about unrelated topics such as: justice and wickedness, humanity vs beasts, oppression, and work: but how does the Preacher draw a correlation between these various thoughts?
- 4. Where do you most often turn for comfort or contentment? Examine the deception of Eve in Genesis 3:1-6 then examine what James says about how sin comes about in James 1:14-18. How does our desire to fulfill our own comfort and contentment actually contribute to rather than alleviate the wickedness and injustice in the world? What must change in order for increased wickedness to not be the outcome?
- 5. In what ways did Jesus personally face wickedness, injustice, and oppression? How can knowing that Jesus faced these atrocious evils bring us comfort when faced with corrupt or unfair circumstances?
- 6. Chapter 4, verse 6 reminds us that contentment with what God has for us is better than chasing after more and more that can never satisfy. Read 1 Timothy 6:3-19, how does Paul's message for Timothy align with what the Preacher is saying in Ecclesiastes 3-4? What are some specific ways you can strive for godly contentment this week?
