SERMON REVIEW DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

These questions are for *after* the sermon and can be used for Life Group discussion, one-to-one discipleship, or personal reflection and application.

As we continue along in our walk through Ecclesiastes, the latter half of chapter 4 presents to us a contrast between living a life in isolation from others and one surrounded by accountable relationships. The one accentuates the vanity of our toil and the other brings us something good and beneficial. It is a passage that teaches us the essential place that community must have in living a good life.

Discussion Questions

- 1. Last week, the Preacher in Ecclesiastes talked about the vanity of envy and contentment with what you have. How were you personally challenged with the message from last Sunday?
- 2. In verses 4:7-8, we are given a picture of a man who strives without regard to people in his life. What conclusions does this type of person come to eventually? Is there an example from your own experience where you saw the vanity of working in isolation?
- 3. Verses 4:9-12 shows us the good of true relationships and community. Even though we probably agree that 'two are better than one', why is it that we often resist getting around people and living in community? What makes going it alone so tempting?
- 4. Verse 13 tells us that being a poor wise youth is better than being an old foolish king. What is the point of the short story that follows? How do we avoid becoming like the old king as we advance in years also?
- 5. As Americans, what cultural influences do we have to battle against in avoiding the folly presented to us in this particular text? How might this be a prudent word for us specifically?
- 6. How does the work of Christ fulfill for us the need for community and accountable relationships? Do you view participation in the body with the same level of personal necessity as this passage (and the whole New Testament) would indicate?
