# **SERMON REVIEW DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

These questions are for *after* the sermon and can be used for Life Group discussion, one-to-one discipleship, or personal reflection and application.

We have now come to the end of this section called the Beatitudes, and Jesus concludes it by comparing his people to salt and light. We get a chance here to see the impact that living rightly has for those who witness it. If last week's passage (Matthew 5:10-12) was about the world's effect on God's people, this is about the effect of God's people on the world.

#### Discussion Questions

- 1. Review from last week: How is it *blessed* to be persecuted for righteousness sake? How is it possible to rejoice and be glad in suffering for Christ?
- 2. Jesus calls his people the *salt of the earth*. Why does he use this metaphor? What does it say about a Christian's effect on the world?
- 3. Why does Jesus talk about salt losing its saltiness? What makes it an odd statement?
- 4. Jesus also uses the word-picture of *light* to describe his people. In what way are salt and light similar?
- 5. Jesus commands us to let our light shine before men. What does that look like when it's lived out? Why are we tempted to hide the light?
- 6. How often do you consider the good works of your life being a witness to Christ and his gospel? How can we live rightly without looking to draw attention to ourselves?
