SERMON REVIEW DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

These questions are for *after* the sermon and can be used for Life Group discussion, one-to-one discipleship, or personal reflection and application.

As we enter into the main body of Jesus' teaching, he begins with a word on anger and dissension amongst brothers. And while it may seem excessive at first glance, Jesus' instruction on these matters is a testimony to how serious God takes our relationships with one another.

Discussion Questions

- 1. Last week in Matthew 5:17-20, Jesus described the righteousness that people of the kingdom were called to. What does this righteousness look like and how does this teaching pave the way for how we understand the rest of the Sermon on the Mount?
- 2. This week's passage is the first of six "You heard it was said..." teachings of Jesus. Why is Jesus teaching this way? Is he contradicting the Old Testament or is he doing something else?
- 3. In reading vv. 21 & 22 together, what is the relationship between murder and anger and insulting someone? What does this say about the nature of relationships amongst God's people?
- 4. Looking at vv. 23-24, what is the relationship between being reconciled with your brother (or sister) and worship? How does this understanding affect how you consider your relationships within church?
- 5. In your own words, what is Jesus' warning in the last two verses? Why is making things right amongst brothers and sisters in Christ so important when it comes to kingdom living?
- 6. How does what God has done for us in Christ affect how we approach our relationships with one another? How does our obedience to this teaching bear on our ability to share the good news of Jesus with the world?

PRAY FOR THE UNREACHED IN OUR COMMUNITY

The Rohingya people are a displaced Muslim people group from the Buddhist country of Myanmar (Burma). There are between two and three million Rohingya in the world today and with only a handful following Jesus. They are considered 0% Christian according to the Joshua Project website. In recent years the Rohingya have been described by the United Nations as one of the most persecuted minorities in the world, with some accusing the Myanmar government of attempted genocide and ethnic cleansing. Today there are several thousand Rohingya refugees living in Milwaukee, and many attend the International Community Center for help assimilating into the U.S. The Rohingya are family oriented and very hospitable, often inviting new friends into their homes for meals. They are devoted to their Islam religion, and many of their children attend a Mosque school. Even after years of living here in the U.S., many Rohingya stay within their own community and have never met a true follower of Jesus or heard about the free gift of salvation that only comes through Christ.

- Pray for more churches and Christians to form lasting relationships with Rohingya people.
- Pray for people of peace from the Rohingya community to be open to hear the truth of the Gospel.
- Pray for the Holy Spirit to work in Rohingya people through dreams and visions of Jesus.
- Pray for peace in Myanmar and that God would change hearts in the Myanmar government.
