SERMON REVIEW DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

These questions are for *after* the sermon and can be used for Life Group discussion, one-to-one discipleship, or personal reflection and application.

We now come to the end of chapter 5, as well as this section of the Sermon on the Mount. This section concludes with a command that, at first glance, might make us think that Jesus couldn't actually be serious about. He calls us to be perfect. And while our normal use of the word "perfect" might cloud our understanding, it is a command we are meant to obey.

Discussion Questions

- 1. In coming to the end of chapter 5, how have you been encouraged from the Sermon on the Mount so far? How have you been challenged?
- 2. Last week, Pastor Isaac walked us through Jesus' teaching about loving your enemies (5:43-47). What would it look like for you to grow in this and put it into practice?
- 3. Jesus' command for us in 5:48 is to *be perfect*. Why is it often easy for us to blow by this verse without taking it as seriously as we ought to? What do we miss out on if we do this?
- 4. Read Leviticus 19:1-2. Jesus seems to be referring to this Old Testament command in his teaching. Why do you suppose he uses "perfect" instead of "holy"? Is there a difference in what Jesus instructs versus what Moses taught?
- 5. We are called to be like our Father in heaven. How does this give us encouragement to press forward in the Christian life and not get lazy? Read Hebrews 10:12-14. How does Jesus' calling us to this standard actually point us toward the good news of what God has done for us (and is doing) in Christ?
