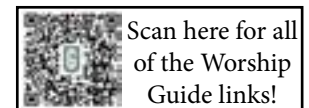

SERMON REVIEW DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

These questions are for *after* the sermon and can be used for Life Group discussion, one-to-one discipleship, or personal reflection and application.

After a week in First Kings, we are back to the Lord's Prayer. And in verse 12, we are taught to pray for our forgiveness. In fact, verse 12 is such a key part to Jesus' teaching in this section that he adds commentary in verses 14-15. How we approach forgiveness is a chief indicator of the condition of our hearts.

Discussion Questions

1. We've spent almost the whole month of June focused specifically on the Lord's Prayer. Has your prayer life been affected by walking through these passages over the last few weeks? If so, how?
2. Jesus commands us to pray for our own forgiveness. Is this a regular part of your prayers to the Lord? What are some of the personal obstacles you have that stand in the way of praying like this regularly? Share specific examples where giving or receiving forgiveness has made a significant mark on your life.
3. Is Jesus telling us that we must forgive others before we can be forgiven by God? If not, how is our forgiveness of others and the forgiveness we receive from God tied together? Why do you think that Jesus included forgiveness as part of the Lord's Prayer?
4. Is there someone in your life that you need to forgive but haven't yet? Why have you withheld forgiveness from them up to this point?
5. How does the gospel make forgiving others, even in the most difficult of cases, possible for those who follow Jesus? Read Matthew 18:21-25 The Parable of the Unforgiving Servant, what does this parable tell us about how Christians should respond when we are wronged?
